## Celebrate Martin Luther King Jr. Weekend Jan. 14-15

There are several opportunities this year to learn about, celebrate and work toward the vision of justice found in the legacy and teaching of Martin Luther King Jr.

At our Sunday morning service on January 14, Steve and Nancy Elder-Wilfrid will lead a worship that will include a sermon preached by the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. at Ebenezer Baptist Church, Atlanta GA, November 5, 1967. We will also sing several of our favorite peace and justice hymns.

On Sunday afternoon at 1:00 pm at the Cathedral of the Pines, distinguished legal historian Michael Klarman will deliver the keynote address for Celebrating Martin Luther King Jr. 2024. In recognizing the 60-year anniversary of the signing of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Professor Klarman will speak on "Brown v. Board, the Civil Rights Movement, and Where We Are Today on Race."

On Monday, January 15, at 5:00 pm, the Park Theatre will host a celebration with the theme "America the Dream" featuring new music created by local folk musician, Steve Schuch. Dr. Cyndy Jean, Conant 2003, will be the featured speaker. Gene Faxon and some of our First Church singers will be a part of the program.

#### Ash Wednesday Service with United Church on February 14

Once again, this year, we will honor the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday (2/14), at a joint service with our friends from the United Church of Jaffrey. The service will be held in the sanctuary of First Church at 5:00 pm and will feature songs, prayers, reflections, and the imposition of ashes. We hope you will join us as we begin our Lenten journey.

### Lenten Study Series: Jesus Before Christianity

Steve will be leading a study series for five weeks on Wednesday afternoons during Lent. These educational gatherings will be held at 4:00 pm in the Parish House beginning on Wednesday, February 21, 2024. The theme of the series is "Jesus Before Christianity." The session will explore the history, theology and spirit of the Jesus movement and examine how it became the religion we now call Christianity. # 2023 Sets Record for First Church Donations to Monadnock Community

The expanded Benevolence Circle met in November and December to allocate funds raised by the Summer Fair and the Pie Sales. Thanks to the hard work of church members and volunteers from the larger community, these two fundraising events were extremely successful. We were able to expand our benevolences into new areas and increase donations to organizations we have helped for many years.

On behalf of First Church, the Benevolence Circle:

### Created two camp scholarships for young people:

Horton Center: 1 week \$575

Scout Camp, for one Scout from Jaffrey's Troop 33: 1 week \$590

Continued support for established community service that target housing, homelessness, hunger, abuse, early childhood education, mental illness, drug and alcohol abuse, medical care, elder care

Home Health Care Hospice and Community Services \$500

Meals on Wheels \$500

Monadnock Area Psychotherapy and Spiritual Services (MAPS) \$300

Monadnock Center for Violence Prevention \$400

Monadnock Community Early Learning Center \$400

Monadnock Family Services \$600

Monadnock Adult Day Care Center \$300

Shelter from the Storm \$600

Reality Check \$500

Got Lunch \$600 (plus a \$500 anonymous donation from a church member)

JR Memorial Ambulance Service \$300

Jaffrey Food Pantry \$500

#### Added two new beneficiaries:

Project Home: New nonprofit based in Keene that funds refugee housing and English as a second language (ESOL) classes \$500

Southwestern Community Services: provides heating/fuel assistance to Monadnock region \$500

These donations totaled \$7,665. We kept \$2,000 in reserve for scholarships to Conant grads to be awarded in May 2024.

#### First Church Christmas Fund

The offering taken at the Candlelight Service on Christmas Eve 2023 will be given to the Jaffrey Town Emergency Assistance Fund, which provides financial help with housing (rent, shelter, mortgages) – a primary need in Jaffrey. First Church has contributed to this agency for many years; we are the only church in town to do so, and our help is greatly appreciated.

They also support organizations in Ukraine, including orphanages and a home for internal refugees which offers psychiatric assistance and sends supplies to the front.

First Church quickly answered an emergency call for help with a Christmas "Wish list" from 29 children in the Dom Matki center in Warsaw by sending letters and money to purchase their "dream gifts."

In late November at the coffee time following worship, individuals gave money and wrote personal notes to the children. Done in one hour!
